News from the Stewardship Committee

The Stewardship Committee is in the midst of the annual campaign – "Honor the Past, Serve the Present, Provide for the Future". It began with a service October 20th that featured members of the congregation talking about the churches finances as well as the many inspirational activities performed by our committees. A letter went out to everyone in the congregation the next day, including a pledge card. The following Sunday was the first witnessing steward talking about her faith journey and what Bethany means to her. There will be two more witnessing stewards leading up to **Dedication Sunday on November 10th.** Members do not have to wait until Dedication Sunday to submit their pledge. A pledge card can be place in the Offertory plate any Sunday; it can be mailed to the office, or it can be dropped by the office. Thank you for prayerful consideration of your pledge for 2020.

Thoughts from Kim...

A Season of Gratitude (Part 2)

As a child I remember hearing sermons about tithing: Giving a tenth of one's time, talent and treasure to God. From a child's perspective only having to give a tenth seemed like a good deal because I got to keep the rest! I remember thinking that tithing was like the dues we pay to be part of God's club – it was very much a transactional arrangement. I would get my allowance and pay my dues to be part of the club!

It was much later in life that I discovered the actual purpose of proportional giving: To help the giver develop generosity, and to meet the needs of others. God does not need our money, but we need to learn to be generous – to hold our treasure with open hands! And because of the great inequity in our world, those who *have* need to regularly share with those who *have not*. From the first recorded accounts of the early church, the equitable distribution of wealth was a primary concern for Christians.

As we approach Stewardship Sunday the church invites each of us to reflect on the values represented in our bank statements and calendars and ask a hard question: If a stranger were to see my expenditures and calendar, what conclusions would they draw about my values, priorities and my faith? And although safeguards keep strangers from looking at such personal data, very often *we* are the strangers to our personal information. Stewardship Sunday invites us to notice – pay attention – and be intentional about how we spend our time, talents and treasure – so these expenditures mirror our values.

Once upon a time the church was the only social service organization in the community, as well as the nurturer and protector of the arts and education. Now many other organizations fill those roles – and they deserve our support! I know that some folks tithe to the church and go above and beyond their tithe to support other organizations. Others have half or more of the tithe going to the church and the rest going to support other worthy endeavors. Some face circumstances that make tithing impossible, and so they give what they can. Others have the resources to go beyond tithing. Unlike the God of my childhood, I don't think God keeps a ledger to make sure our dues are paid, but I do believe that the spiritual discipline of giving is meant to increase our capacity for *intentional* generosity and gratitude.

By now you have received your pledge card for 2020. Please prayerfully fill it out and return it to church by Stewardship Sunday, taking some time to reflect on how you can give to God by investing in the life and ministry of Bethany UCC. The scope of the mission and ministry we undertake here at Bethany is directly related to the generosity of our members. What you give matters!

Although Americans think of the fourth Thursday in November as the day to give thanks, I think that the second Sunday in November - Stewardship Sunday - is also a great thanksgiving day. Just imagine what a church full of grateful, generous stewards can do – and then join us in making that vision a reality!

Coming to Bethany - Body Balance Class with Melissa DeMattio

Mondays and Wednesdays from 11:30 am -12:30 pm in the Social Hall Beginning November 4th

Does the coming of winter have you worrying about slips and falls? If so, join us for Balance Class. Balance classes are regularly attended by individuals of all ages with varied mobility, with the primary goals as follows:

- Help each individual maintain independence as they age
- Use proper joint movement and range of motion
- Enhance balance skills by keeping muscles toned and moving properly
- Practice fall prevention by being aware of your surroundings.

This class is also designed for those who have been sedentary and need to increase their activity level. These exercises are great for rehabilitation for those that have been inactive or bedridden due to injury or illness. Additionally, these exercises are used to enhance balance for fall prevention and give each person the confidence to stay independent!

Each class lasts 45 minutes. There is no set fee to participate – a basket will be available to make a donation to the instructor (suggested donation of \$ 5 per session). The first class on November 4th will be for orientation - to answer any questions and to discuss the needs of the participants. Melissa DeMattio is a trainer with the Cleveland Clinic/Akron General Lifestyles program, and welcomes this opportunity to provide tools for the wellbeing of the folks at Bethany. 

Preparing for Advent

The Season of Advent begins on Sunday, December 1st. Traditionally Advent is a time for watching and waiting – for preparing one's heart to birth Christ's love into the world. Here are two steps you can take now to make your Advent journey rich and meaningful:



- 1. **Lighten and focus your December schedule**. Block out time each day for "watching and waiting." This can include meditation, quiet contemplation, and "waiting" as a discipline of service (like "waiting" on tables). Build in **non-stressful meaningful time** with family and friends and with those who are lonely. Build in **silence and time for awe and wonder for mystery.**
- 2. **Select an Advent Devotional to assist you in your contemplative reflection.** Reading a devotional can be a good way to focus thoughts and prayers during the Advent Season. There are many different options.

The UCC Still Speaking Writer's Group produces a new Advent Devotional each year. This year it is called "A New Earth" and celebrates all of creation (with an environmental theme woven throughout the reflections). We have received 40 copies of this devotional (suggested donation \$ 5) and have them available in worship each Sunday beginning November 10th or in the church office during the week.
