Thoughts from Kim—



Each year Lent invites us to slow down, pair down and focus on what truly matters. Through a variety of opportunities we are invited to acknowledge and release the past, simplify the present, and build a future that makes space for the new life of the resurrection – all packed into six weeks!

I invite you to look at the many good opportunities Bethany is offering during Lent and pick one or two as your focus. Perhaps it will be working with a devotional and setting aside a few minutes to just sit with God each day (highly recommended as a first choice). Or maybe it will be taking on a servce activity as sponsored by Bethany's Mission Committee. You might decide to make worship a priority and attend both Sunday and Thursday evening services. Or maybe you will attend one of the classes offered on Thursdays during Lent. Whatever you decide to do, please do something! Lent is powerful medicine – please give yourself the opportunity to benefit from this ancient prescription.

And speaking of medicine...during Lent we revisit stories about Jesus bringing healing and wholeness to people, noticing how Jesus demonstrated deep care and compassion with those who were in need. In keeping with Lent being a time for *Compassion and Care*, Bethany is launching two new initiatives:

Care Notes – Thanks to a generous donation from a friend of the church, Pastor Kim was able to purchase our first set of Care Notes, which are simple brochures that deal with important situations like grief and loss, change, illness, addiction, experiences teens face, and spiritual issues like prayer and observing Lent (and many more topics). Pastor Kim will put three racks of Care Notes in the back of the church and one rack by the elevator. If you see a Care Note that you think will help you or someone you know, take it and read it or pass it along! Over time Pastor Kim will add to our selection of Care Notes so as to address additional issues. If you would like to make a financial contribution towards our Care Notes outreach, make your check payable to Bethany UCC and write Pastor's Discretionary Fund on the ledger line.

Care Team – It is time to build on the good work of our Lay Visitors, Jan Charton and Lynette Sheppard, by expanding our Visitation Ministry to include others who would like to visit a home-bound member of our church family. The commitment would be to visit your assigned person once per month and remember them on holidays and their birthday, and to meet with Pastor Kim and other Care Team members twice per year for a check in and skills training. Each Care Team member will have an orientation with Pastor Kim and become part of this ministry team. If you are interested in joining the Bethany Care Team, please speak with Pastor Kim. She is hoping to launch the Care Team by Easter!

Whatever you choose as your Lenten opportunity/discipline, I trust that God will bless you and open your heart to new life and new growth – to spring – which, after all, is the meaning of the word *Lent*. And just as the new shoots are poking through the outdoor soil, let the spiritual growth within us commence!

Being on the committee does not commit you to participating in every mission. All are welcome to attend. Mission is going to provide the social hour for our special Irish Service on Sunday, March 15. If you are interested in assisting us, we would appreciate the extra help.

<u>Successful Collection</u>—Thanks to everyone who brought in personal care items for Good Neighbors. We collected a total of 405 items. Many will benefit from your generosity.

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering

<u>Red Cross Blood Drives</u>—We are excited to announce we will begin hosting Red Cross Blood Drives on Tuesday, May 19 from 9 a.m. -3 p.m. As the date of the first drive draws near, we will provide information about donating and ways our members can promote this outreach opportunity to family and friends. *Every two seconds someone in America needs blood.*

<u>Lenten Calendar</u> - Missions has provided a Lenten Calendar to encourage members to step up and support our members, our church events, our community and the food drive for Good Neighbors. We hope these suggestions will encourage you to give of yourself during Lent. The calendar is included in this bulletin and will be available in church on Sunday to serve as a reminder.

Family Promise Updates - Many of you will remember 16 years ago when Bethany hosted our first homeless family. We knew we were a part of a special mission that would help many families in Summit County. The rotation model that we have been using and will continue to be a part of helps up to 4 families at one time. The Family Promise Network is now taking on a new adventure that will allow this mission to help an additional 9 families to accomplish their goal to find housing. This is a very exciting time for the Family Promise mission. We have included information on this new model in the attached Family Promise update. Many items are needed to furnish the 9 apartments. There is a list included of items needed to Stuff the Truck. On March 28 we will organize Bethany members to go to this new facility to deliver the items we have collected. Thanks for considering supporting this new additional model of Family Promise. Our next Bethany host week is April 12 – 19 with many volunteer opportunities available.

Noisy Offering - The mission committee is asking members to save their pocket change during Lent. On Palm Sunday we will have our traditional noisy offering where we ask member to donate the change to benefit Bethany Missions. We hope to hear a loud clamor!

<u>Good Neighbors Collection -</u> Our focus for March for Good Neighbors is food. We are collecting a different food item each as listed on the Lenten calendar: Canned beef stew, vegetables, tuna and soup and peanut butter and boxed cereal. This is a great opportunity to support our neighbors and our local community. Food insecurity is real in our own backyard.

Family Promise Update

What is the Glendora House for Homeless Families with Children?

The Glendora House is an apartment building which was built in the 1920s. It is located at the corner of Glendora Avenue and Copley Road next to the John R. Buchtel Community Learning Center.

Ownership and Operation

The building is owned by the **Battered Women's Shelter of Summit & Medina Counties**. Family Promise of Summit County took possession of The Glendora House from Battered Women's Shelter of Summit & Medina Counties on April 4, 2018 via a Memorandum of Understanding executed between the two organizations. Battered Women's Shelter is, and will remain, the owner of the property. Family Promise of Summit County will occupy and operate the building to shelter its clients, homeless families with children, for many years to come.

Increased Capacity to Serve Homeless Families with Children

The Glendora House will compliment our existing, congregation-based Rotation Model of services and assist Family Promise in serving more families. It will also allow us to serve larger families of five members or more. The addition of the Glendora House will allow us to increase the number of families serve at one time from four, using our congregation-based Rotation Model of services, to up to 13 homeless families with children!

Building Details

The Glendora House is a four-story building. The ground floor will include a laundry room, children's learning and play space and computer room for families, similar to our Day Center on Voris Street.

It will also hold a case management office where families will develop their Sustainable Independence Plans, as well as receive financial literacy education and Open Table Mentoring Services. We will continue to work with the **University of Akron's School of Social Work** to offer valuable internships for their students. In order to meet the needs of the increased number of families served, we are going to hire a part-time case manager this Spring.

Lastly, the ground floor will contain an Emergency Shelter Unit. The Emergency Shelter Unit will provide temporary housing to families until they are placed in a traditional shelter program via the Homeless Hotline. The average stay in the Emergency Shelter Unit will be approximately 3 to 5 days. The Emergency Shelter Unit will be in partnership with the **Summit County Department of Job and Family Services (SCDJFS)** who will financially support the unit annually.

The second, third and fourth floors contain three, identical apartments for a total of 9 apartments in the building.

Renovations

Total renovation expenses for the Glendora House are \$560,000 and we have raised \$500,000 toward this goal.

Since taking possession of the property, we have:

- Installed new windows throughout all four floors of the building.
- Replaced the entire boiler heating system with a brand-new system and new duct work throughout the building.
- · Updated the electric system.
- Updated the plumbing system.
- Sealed the asphalt driveway.
- · Installed a new roof.
- Installed an external camera system.
- · Installed new LED lights for energy conservation throughout the building.
- Completed one apartment which will house the first family starting February 6th!
- Renovation is in progress on the eight remaining apartments.

We are working with **Truly Reaching You (TRY)** to help with the renovations. TRY is a nonprofit organization that provides a healthy reentry support system for men reconnecting with self, family, and community. Once Glendora House is complete and open, TRY will provide regular maintenance on the building to keep it clean and safe.
